Pastoral Update

Dear Parents

It has been a pleasure to compile my first Pastoral update, since joining Sir Thomas Rich's as Deputy Headteacher.

To complement the termly emails from Heads of Year, Heads of Key Stage and the regular communications from the Headteacher, these updates aim to keep parents informed about whole-school pastoral matters throughout the academic year.

Whole-School Assemblies

Our traditional bi-weekly whole school assemblies have recommenced this term. These take place alongside individual year group assemblies within the two-week timetable. So far, Mr Lynch has addressed the School on getting the 'little things' right such as uniform, behaviour and keeping the School clean and tidy. Mr Dempsey's assembly touched upon self-discipline and hard work. He spoke about how both attributes have allowed him to be a part of Prize Giving; whether receiving a prize as a pupil, to announcing the awards at his 34th event, which was held at the beginning of October. In my first whole-school assembly, I spoke about being an active bystander, and the difference we can all make by uniting against negative behaviour. The golden thread running through each of these assemblies being what it means to be a true Richian: getting the little things right, self-discipline and looking out for each other. We look forward to continuing our programme of whole-school assemblies after half term.

PSHE

All pupils in Key Stage 3 have begun the new Autumn Term schemes of work. Year 7 pupils have explored ways to manage transitions in life, online safety and healthy relationships. Year 8 pupils have been exploring attitudes to drugs, the law and managing risk and influence. In Year 9, pupils have considered the impact of puberty on relationships, returning to the themes of healthy and unhealthy relationships and the importance of consent.

Pupils in Year 8 have also recently attended an anti-bullying presentation which was both thought provoking and highly informative. Our external speaker was Rob Higgs, and he used a combination of drama and small group activities that kept pupils engaged throughout. He also provided very practical advice on how to build resilience and encouraged pupils to reflect on their own treatment of others, as well as understanding the power of being an active bystander.

As part of our ongoing commitment to raise awareness of important issues within modern society, the interactive play 'Chelsea's Story' was presented to Year 8 pupils on 3 October. The play, which is performed by Narrative Alchemy and supported by the Gloucestershire Safeguarding Children Partnership, alerted pupils to the dangers of child exploitation and provided them with guidance as to where to seek help should they feel at risk. We believe that this is a powerful way to enhance our PSHE curriculum and help our students to stay safe.

Year 12 have begun their programme of Enrichment, which aims to nurture students' personal, social moral and cultural understanding. Topics this half term have included stress management, higher education, employability and the labour market, alcohol safety and online behaviour including professional identity. We are grateful to Mrs García (Assistant Headteacher) and Mr Marks (Head of Enrichment) for co-ordinating these provisions.

Tommy's Award

Pupils across the School have begun their efforts towards achieving the Tommy's Award (2024 - 2025). The Tommy's Award recognises our pupils' efforts and achievements both in and outside the classroom. Pupils will be working towards demonstrating their skills in the following areas:

- Leadership
- Connectedness
- Creativity
- · Adventure and endeavour
- Personal learning
- Service and commitment

Last year, we had many pupils achieve the award in Year 7 (Bronze), Year 8 (Silver), and Year 9 (Gold) receiving their Tommy's Award badges in the summer term. We look forward to supporting the pupils in achieving this prestigious award over the coming terms. Pupils can check their progress online, and we would encourage parents to support the award by periodically checking progress, too.

House Competitions

Congratulations to Eastgate on winning the 2023/4 Cock House Cup, securing their victory in the last event of the school year, House Drama. The 2024/5 Cock House Cup is already underway, with Westgate winning House Chess

and currently leading with 5 points. Eastgate and Southgate tie for second with 4 points, Newgate are in fourth position with 2 points and Northgate in fifth place with one point.

Extracurricular


