Dear Parents

In School, it is very much starting to feel like the Christmas holiday is upon us. We have decorated the School Christmas Tree, which has pride of place in the main hall, many staff have decorated their classrooms, and our pupils are getting increasingly excited!

We are still eagerly anticipating a few Christmas events: our School Christmas Meal, final Whole School Christmas Assembly and the Carol Service, which will take place on 19 December at Holy Trinity Church, Longlevens, starting at 18.00. Attendance

As we mention regularly to pupils and at Parent Information Evenings earlier in the academic year, we are aware that there is a strong correlation between high attendance and high attainment.

This has also been reflected in the Department for Education tightening its statutory guidance in relation to attendance in August of this year. Our school data continues to reflect this at both GCSE and A Level. The percentage of those students getting 8 and 9 grades at GCSE, or A/A* grades at A Level is significantly higher for those pupils whose attendance is above 90% (below 90% attendance is defined as 'persistently absent').

You may receive a letter in the future highlighting that your son is 'persistently absent'. These letters are purely for information as we are aware that there may be circumstances to explain the level of absence. However, as we continue to move through the academic year, we would appreciate your support in ensuring that all our pupils are in school as much as possible.

Uniform

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and pupils of our expectations for high standards of uniform. As we move through the winter months, particularly January and February, we appreciate your support in reminding your son of the need to wear a plain black or grey V-neck jumper under his blazer if he wishes; hoodies and crested / branded jumpers are not permitted. Your son may also wear a coat on top of his blazer when travelling to and from school.

Tutor Time Programme

The second half of the Autumn term has been busy in tutor time with our usual round of Whole School, Head of Year and House assemblies. We look forward to our final Whole School Assembly which will be an opportunity for the School to come together to celebrate the successes of the year so far.
