GCSE Trials

On behalf of our team of invigilators, I would like to pass on much-deserved praise to our Year 11 students, who have navigated their GCSE trial examinations over the last two weeks; pupils have shown great determination and maturity in what can be a stressful period. Year 11 subject teachers are now hard at work marking mock papers, and pupils will initially receive feedback in lessons over the coming weeks. Mock results will be published on Parent Gateway before the end of this half term.

As I mentioned before the examination period, the feedback pupils will now receive should give clear guidance on their next steps for preparing for the summer examinations. This will include specific topic areas that may need greater attention, subject specific skills that need further clarification, whilst also reminding pupils to put their revision to the test as often as possible using the available past papers and mark schemes for each subject. The key message to our Year 11 pupils is that time is still very much on their side, and much can still be achieved with continued hard work and reaching out for support.

Sixth Form Open Evening

A reminder that our Sixth Form Open Evening takes place on Thursday 30 January. All Year 11 students and parents are, of course, invited; there will be an introductory talk at 6.00pm and 7.00pm in the main hall, followed by the opportunity to visit departments and A Level subject teachers. Many of our current Sixth Form students will also be on hand during the evening to speak about A Level study from their point of view.

As always with our Open Evenings, we will endeavour to park as many visitors on our school site as possible. However, due to it not being possible to park cars on our field at this time of year, it may be the case that you are directed to park in the local area. If this is the case, a polite reminder to park with due consideration of our neighbours.

Parent Survey Results and the Listening Post
