I wanted to pass on sections of an email I have received from Avril, who is one of the main logistical organisers of the event this year. I would like to stress that each and every word she has said I agree with wholeheartedly.

'We hope that your participants had a fantastic experience. I was fortunate enough to speak with many of them as they crossed the finish line and around the campsite. For those who didn't complete their challenge due to being reserves or otherwise, please know that their perseverance and determination were no less impressive — we are all incredibly proud of each and every one of them.

We are also reviewing feedback that some participants were disappointed with the medal. We always take feedback seriously, and for those who would prefer a metal medal, we will be making these available at the Team Managers' Briefing in October. We also want to acknowledge and apologise for the traffic issues experienced over the weekend. We understand that some spectators were unable to reach the finish line in time to see their young people cross and those that did make it to Okehampton then experienced significant delays departing. This is a real concern, and we are already looking at ways to improve this for next year.

Later this week I will be notified of the Army's review of the team's route and whether they incurred any infringements during their challenge. (e.g. river crossings at the wrong points or going into bird nesting areas accidentally). If they have made any of these errors they will not receive a team certificate. I will be able to review the route with the group and consider an appeal if they have sufficient evidence which goes against the GPS tracker data. Understandably their medals for the completion of the challenge successfully will still stand. If no infringements have occurred then they will receive a team certificate.

Thank you for supporting your children throughout this challenge it has been a privilege working with them and yourselves this year.
