Good Schools Guide

Just before the recent holiday, we were pleased to welcome a reviewer from the Good Schools Guide (GSG) for a visit to our school. During her time with us, the reviewer experienced tutor time with 8B, met with pupils from a range of year groups, joined Year 8 pupils for a tour of the School, and spent time with Year 7 and Year 9 pupils over lunch. Our pupils were excellent ambassadors for the School; they were described as articulate, welcoming, and enthusiastic throughout.

As I am sure you are aware, the GSG is completely independent and we have no influence at all over their final report. The review is now live, and I am pleased to say it is extremely positive about the School, summing up Sir Thomas Rich's as:

"A popular and ever-evolving grammar school known for its academics and sport, although there's much more besides. Great community feel and a place where pupils can be themselves."

Bletchley Park Visit

Our Year 8 pupils visited Bletchley Park this week, the centre of British codebreaking during the Second World War. During the trip, pupils took part in a coding and ciphers workshop, where they were introduced to a range of encryption techniques and challenged to solve puzzles using methods inspired by those employed during wartime. The group also enjoyed a guided tour of the site, learning about the significant work carried out at Bletchley Park and its pivotal role in the Allied war effort. Staff who attended the visit praised Year 8 for their excellent critical thinking skills and exemplary conduct throughout the day. Greece Trip

At the end of last half term and into the holiday, Year 12 students took part in trip to Greece where they were involved in a project working with homeless people and refugees in Athens; this was followed by visiting and supporting a marine conservation turtle rescue programme. Our hosts in Greece could not speak more highly of the Year 12 visitors – not just for their fantastic fundraising, but also their dedicated and mature approach to all the project work experience.
